The Third Global Summit on Peace through Tourism will be held at Royal Cliff Beach Resort, Pattaya, Thailand, October 2-5, 2005. The Summit is being organized by International Institute for Peace through Tourism (IIPT) with the support and collaboration of the Thailand Convention and Exhibition Bureau (TCEB) and World Tourism Organization (WTO).

The 3rd Global Summit will feature leading government officials, NGO decision makers, world leaders and statesmen in the travel and tourism industry as keynote speakers, as well as leaders from the areas of Culture, Environment, Sport, Poverty Reduction and Sustainable Development.

A series of Concurrent sessions will provide leading edge case studies of "Success Stories" and Models of Best Practice demonstrating travel and tourism initiatives that are serving to promote cultural and international understanding, enhancement of ecological and biodiversity, an improved quality of environment, poverty reduction and sustainable development. The Summit will also address the growing contribution of sport to international understanding and development – and what more can be done in each of these areas through collaborative initiatives.

An "Education Forum," with leading educators from around the world, a Youth Leadership Forum, and a Young Professionals Forum will also be featured as IIPT continues to place emphasis on future leaders of the industry since its first Global Conference in Vancouver, Canada, 1988. STUDENT ESSAY COMPETITION

To further stimulate thinking among students of tourism and hospitality in advance of the Summit, IIPT will award a US \$1,000 to the University student writing the best paper on "Building a Culture of Peace through Tourism." Essays of no more than 15 pages double spaced need to be submitted to Education Forum Chairman before July 1, 2005.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Three-page abstracts (typed double-spaced) of proposed papers should be submitted for the final selection process before May 31, 2005. Indicate the author's name and affiliation only on the cover page of the abstract and they should not be indicated anywhere in the abstract.

Paper Review Committee will conduct a refereed screening of abstracts. Authors of accepted abstracts will be asked to submit completed papers before August 31, 2005. Once the paper is accepted, at least one of the authors must register for and present the paper at the Conference.
