
3RD GLOBAL SUMMIT ON PEACE THROUGH TOURISM

3RD GLOBAL SUMMIT TO ADDRESS SUSTAINED TRAVEL INDUSTRY RESPONSE TO TSUNAMI AFFECTED AREAS

A key goal of the 3rd Global Summit on Peace through Tourism is to develop a sustained travel industry response to the social and economic re-vitalization of tsunami affected countries in support of the Pacific Asia Travel Association (PATA).

The 3rd Global Summit on Peace through Tourism is being held October 2-5, 2005 at the award winning Royal Cliff Beach Resort and Conference Center, Pattaya, Thailand.



A plenary session to be moderated by PATA President and CEO Peter DeJong will focus on identifying actions and strategies by which the travel and tourism industry can make a significant contribution to the long term redevelopment of tsunami affected areas, particularly areas which thrive on tourism.
